The new age understanding of the design is that it represents strength, good luck, and safe travel across water. The fish-hook shape of the hei matau finds its origins in Māori legend, which holds that the North Island of New Zealand was once a huge fish that was caught by the great mariner Maui using only a woven line and a hook made from the jawbone of his grandmother. The fish hook denotes the importance of fishing to the Maori people of New Zealand, and their strong relationship to Tangaroa, the god of the sea.

The Manaia is an Iwi Spiritual Guardian, Provider and Protector over the air, waters and land. They normally have the head of a bird (sky), the body of a man (earth) and the tail of a fish (sea) symbolic of the balance they have between all three realms.

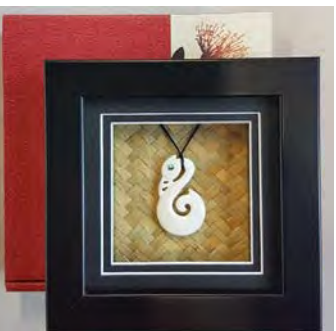
FRAMED MAORI BONE CARVING

In Maori design, the Koru has a dual meaning. It is commonly used in Maori art as a symbol of creation. It is also said to represent new life and in business, new beginnings and the strengthening of existing relationships.

You will notice the Koru is carved "clockwise". Traditionally known as "sun wise circling", it represents good luck. This is because to move sun wise is to be in harmony with the earth's movement around the sun.

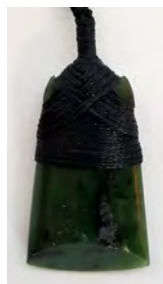

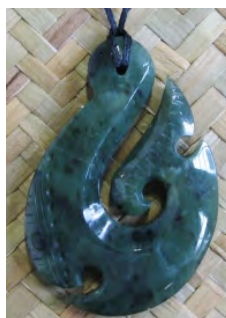

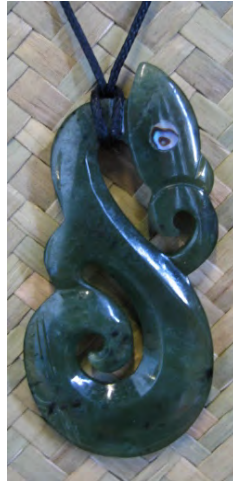

FRAMED MAORI WOOD CARVING

WHEKU

The Wheku is found on the apex of the gable on the front of large carved houses and Marae (Maori Meeting House). It symbolizes an important ancestor after whom the house was name and hence the recipient of this gift is also perceived as an important person, associate or company.

The head is usually represented on its own with no part of the body visible. In old houses it is actually carved on the projecting end of the ridgepole (tahuhu) and the body figure will be seen on the ridgepole.

WOOD ART - TUATARA

The Tuatara (native to New Zealand) is the only living fossil in the world. All its relatives died over 60 million years ago.

Tuatara are reptiles and thus cold blooded. They shed their skin like a snake does once a year, can regrow their tails, range in colour from green to brown to orange, can change their colour over their life time and can hold their breath for nearly an hour. They live on average for 60 years (some have been recorded over 100 years old).

They are nocturnal, preferring to forage for food – mainly insects, lizards, sea bird eggs and chicks at night.

Tuatara feature in a number of Maori Legends and are held as Ariki (God forms). Today, Tuatara are regarded as a taonga (special treasure).

WOOD ART - TE MATAU A MAUI

In ancient Maori folklore, the exploits of Maui (half God/half man) stand unrivalled.

On one such adventure, Maui stowed away in the waka (canoe) when his four older brothers departed on a fishing expedition. When they were far from the land, Maui revealed himself and convinced his brothers to paddle further out to the deepest sea where the fish would be in abundance.

With his enchanted fish hook, which he had fashioned from the jawbone of his great grandmother, with its paua (abalone) shell eyes to see in the depths of the sea and a tuft of dog hair to keep the hook warm in the freezing depths and to retain the scent of the bait (blood from his nose) Maui cast his fishing line.

As soon as his hook descended to the ocean floor, it was devoured by a giant fish. The ocean foamed and boiled as Maui struggled with all his strength to the fish. Finally, the fish yielded and floated to the surface.

Te Ika-a-Maui (The fish of Maui) more commonly known as the North Island of New Zealand had arisen in the South Pacific Ocean. Te Waka a Maui (The canoe of Maui) is known as the South Island and Stewart Island is Te Punga a Maui (Maui's anchor).

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WOOD ART - WHEKU

The Whetu as found on the apex of the gable on the front of a large carved house symbolizes an important ancestor after whom the house was named. The house itself represents his body. The sloping bargeboards being his arms (maihi) the rafters (heke) being his ribs and the inside being his stomach or bosom. The head is usually represented on its own with no part of the body visible. In old houses it is actually carved on the projecting end of the ridgepole (tahuhu) and the body figure will be seen on the ridgepole.

There are many tribal variations in how the head is represented. The three main styles of head are: the whetu, the koruru and the ruru, each distinguished by the shape around the eyes.

WOOD ART - HEI TIKI

The origins of "Tiki" are uncertain but throughout Maoridom he is acknowledged as the first man and that he came from the stars. He is sometimes depicted as an amphibious person with large fishlike eyes and webbed feet and considered the teacher of all things.

"Hei Tiki" had spiritual significance to Maori. They were passed down from generation to generation and it was believed that they acquired the importance and power (mana) of each of the passed ancestors (Tipuna) to have worn it.

The wearer is assumed to be of strong character, clear thinking, perceptive, loyal and knowledgeable.

MATAU (symbol for provision and prosperity). Stylised form of the old Maori fish hook. With symbolism derived from when the legendary demi god Maui fished up the North Island using a magical fishhook made from the jawbone of his grandfather. It has also come to represent, as it did for Maui, good luck and bounty.

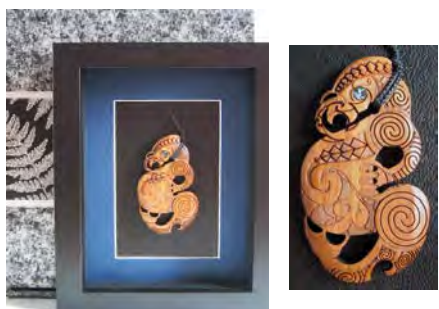

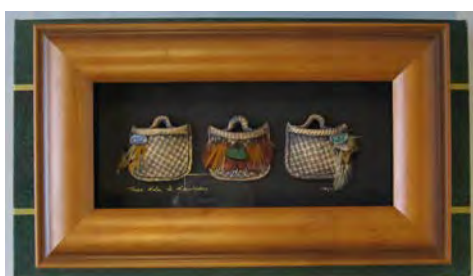

For that reason, it is known as the New Zealand Christmas Tree. The Maori believe that the pohutukawa blossom predicts whether the coming summer will be long and hot, or shorter and cooler.

FERN FROND

The silver fern is becoming increasingly recognised overseas as the national symbol of New Zealand.

It was originally adopted by the New Zealand Native Rugby Team which visited England in 1888 and has since formed part of the uniform (or badge) of successive representative sporting teams. From the early 1900s, the fern leaf has been used as a trademark for meat and dairy exports. On 18 May 1908 to mark the attainment of Dominion status, the Secretary of State for Colonies approved the New Zealand Government's proposal to substitute a wreath of fern leaves for the laurel wreath on the Governor's Ensign. This usage also continued until about 1935.

The fern leaf has been used as a distinguishing badge for New Zealand military formations, particularly during the Second World War, and was also used to mark the graves of New Zealand servicemen in overseas countries. In the most recent revision (1963) of the New Zealand Coat of Arms, two fern leaves provide a base for the supporters to stand upon.

The Silver Fern says "New Zealand".
